Our students have been hard at work all year exercising their community service skills.

A major goal of Student Council is to become an active leader in the community service projects that WCS students undertake each year. **The first project they are tackling is Creek Clean-up on April 26th.** Student Council and the 4th graders took part in the "Digging into Creeks" educational program offered by the Effie Yeaw Nature Center on Thursday, April 10th. The focus of this program is to develop awareness and understanding of community creeks as part of a larger watershed system and to reinforce the importance of protecting creek habitats and wildlife. Students enjoyed a slide show which included photos of previous Creek Clean-up Days. The students are motivated more than ever to doing their part to clean-up our local creeks. And they are motivating their younger peers also by sharing all that they learned on this program.

classes to talk to the students about the importance of creeks and delivering Creek Clean-up posters and bookmarks. The Council also plans on having a small station set up by Steelhead Creek with items such as magnifying glasses, nets, creature peepers, and clipboards so children can explore the creek when they are done with the clean-up effort.

The second project the Council is tackling is the **Recycling for the Heifer International Project**. Student Council members are picking up bottles and cans from the classrooms on a weekly basis. Each class is striving to be able to purchase a gift of an animal. Here are their goals:

To date, our school has made \$325 from recycling. **That is over 6000 bottles and cans recycled so far.** Way to go! Not only are our kids helping end world hunger, but they are also helping the environment by being active recyclers. For more information, you can visit the website www.heifer.org.

In addition, Mrs. Burwinkel is in the process of making a video about the Heifer International Project at our school. The hope is to raise awareness in the community (businesses and our families) and to obtain donations to the project efforts. The Executive members of the Student Council have already been videotaped explaining the origins of Heifer International and its purpose. In the upcoming weeks, each class will be filmed for the movie/commercial.

The students at WCS would like to report that our garden is growing well. All the vegetables are now labeled in English and Spanish to help us learn. All 233 students have had a chance to plant various flowers and vegetables including herbs, red potatoes, carrots, beets, strawberries, eggplant, cucumbers and pumpkins.

About 15 of us were there recently when our gardener came to water the garden and he harvested five big broccoli heads which were ready. We all quickly ate them raw in about 10 minutes.

The lettuce and radishes are almost ready to harvest and we ask our fellow students to not pick any vegetables unless our teacher or gardener is there and says it's OK to pick them.

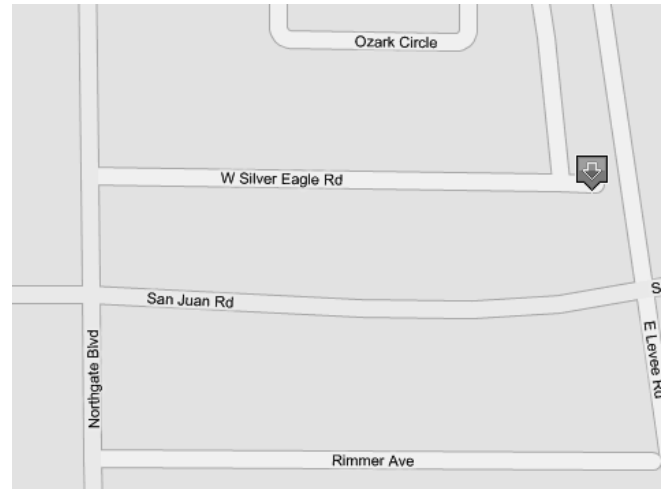

Creek Clean-up

First we clean, 9-11:30 a.m.

Directions to Steelhead Creek (site #1):

Travel on to Truxel Rd.
Turn left on to San Juan Rd. if coming from the north
turn right if coming from the South.
Turn left on to Northgate
Turn right on to West Silver Eagle (next to El Pollo Loco)
We will meet at the dead end on the levee road.
Carpooling is encouraged.



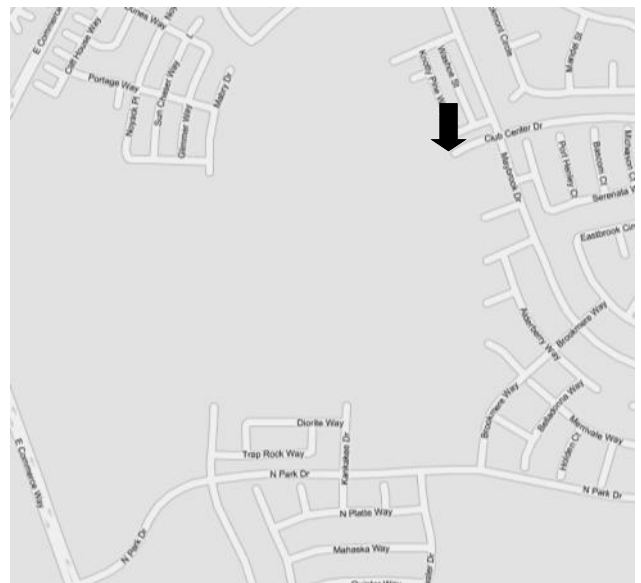
Directions to Creek Clean-Up (Site #2): (Recommended to families with young children)

From Westlake Charter School:

Travel East on Del Paso Rd.
Turn left on East Commerce (next to Safeway shopping center)
Turn right on North Park
Turn left on Kokomo
Turn right on Club Center Dr.
Park along Club Center Dr. near Maybrook
Clean-up will be along the bike trails and waterways off of Club Center Dr.

From Natomas Blvd. (near Raley's shopping center):

Travel North on Natomas Blvd.
Turn left on Club Center Dr.
Cross Maybrook and park along Club Center Dr.



Festivities and lunch at Discovery Museum start promptly at noon. We suggest bringing a change of clothes rather than going home to change.

Then we celebrate, 12-2:00 p.m. at the Discovery Museum .

Directions to Discovery Museum:

Take I-80 Reno
Exit Watt Ave.
Turn right on to Watt Ave.
Turn left on Auburn Blvd.
Discovery Museum is on the left side
3615 Auburn Boulevard, Sacramento
Park at Renfree Field just east of the Center
